About Amman International Film Festival – Awal Film (AIFF)

In its third edition, Amman International Film Festival – Awal Film (AIFF) continues to thrive and grow; an unprecedented event in the Kingdom that showcases Arab and international films. The aim of the AIFF, according to its president Princess Rym Ali, is “developing and promoting an Arab cinema that reflects the creativity of the region and tackles the issues that are prevalent today.”

The distinctive edge of this festival lies in its focus on first timers. An international Jury made up of industry professionals choose the winner of the Black Iris Award in each of the Arab film competitions; feature narrative, feature documentary, and short. While International narrative and documentary films compete for the Audience Award.

Moreover, the jury members may decide to grant a Special Mention to: first-time Lead Actor/Actress and/or first-time Scriptwriter in the Arab Feature-Length Narrative Competition; first-time Editor in the Arab Feature-Length Documentary Competition.

This year's line-up is filled with emotional, honest, heartwarming, and soul-searching stories. The line-up of the third edition features 49 films – narratives and documentaries, Arab and international – from 29 countries. They have all been released in 2021 – 2022, showcased for the first time in Jordan, and in some cases in the region and the world, made by first-time directors or starring first-time experiences.

The “First & Latest” section features the work of one veteran filmmaker, showcasing the process between his first and latest film. We are delighted to host this year Egyptian auteur and acclaimed director Yousry Nasrallah.

In this edition, the Festival continues with its commitment to present powerful and unique content and to initiate collaborations that reflect cultural and environmental awareness. For the second year in a row, the Festival hosts the special Franco-Arab Rendez-Vous section, adding to the diversity of the programming. In addition, the Festival persists in taking its “green steps” towards a sustainable and an environmentally friendly festival.

The Amman International Film Festival – AWAL Film aims to foster a creative buzz among directors, celebrities and film enthusiasts, by offering high-quality films, regardless of their box-office performance. Whether you are a budding Arab filmmaker or an international veteran, an actor or a critic, an industry insider or an enthusiastic consumer, Amman International Film Festival – Awal Film welcomes you!

About Amman Film Industry Days

Amman Film Industry Days, aimed at the industry professionals and film students, will be held from 21st to 26th July 2022.

Amman Film Industry Days host workshops, seminars and sessions with industry professionals focusing on current issues in the industry.

For the second year, Amman Film Industry Days highlight environmental themes. This year, we host an inspiring day - “Climate Storytelling” - that brings environmental experts and filmmakers to collaborate and formulate priorities and develop a cinematic language integrating climate issues into their stories.

Amman Film Industry Days continues to develop its Pitching Platforms for the third year. This year, we added a third development platform dedicated to first-time Jordanian or Arab directors residing in Jordan, in addition to the existing development and post-production platforms open to all Arabs. We also launched the Amman Film Market. 18 projects are selected to compete at the platforms and the Market to receive cash and in-kind awards.

The Awards ceremony will be held at the Royal Film Commission on July 26.

Welcome Note

Some of us may remember the first film we fell in love with, and, given the opportunity, we may have watched it again and again. But how many of us can identify what it was exactly about the film that made us walk out of the cinema feeling fulfilled somehow: was it the story? A particular actor? The backdrop? The music? How all these elements worked in harmony to create a work of art that was pleasing or provocative, educational or inspiring?

This year's artistic theme for the Amman International Film Festival - Awal Film (AIFF) is "First Film, First Love:" it is our hope that you will fall in love with someone's first film, while at the same time, we can't help but wonder with which of the first films in competition the jury will fall in love.

Looking back at the history of cinema, there are of course very famous first films that became huge successes- think of "Citizen Kane" by Orson Welles in 1941 in the US, or how Francois Truffaut's "400 Blows" took off around the world to the surprise of many in the industry. Here in Jordan, more recently, "Theeb" - a first film by a Jordanian film director - was our moment of pride when it received an Oscar nomination.

In this year's Arab narrative selection of the AIFF, family, children and mothers seem to be the main characters. They are seen struggling to maintain their livelihood, their dignity or to improve their lot in life. Personal relationships are laid bare by several young filmmakers, mainly between children and their parents, where the filmmakers at times explore how one generation's deeds unwittingly affect another generation. They include a number of stories from or related to Jordan. But we also have, for the first time at the AIFF, a contribution from Somalia.

Our documentary selection touches on varied topics and in many different styles: some intimate individual stories reflecting on big topics in a new daring cinematic language, or big stories told in a very personal manner.

As for the Shorts selection, family, displacement and identity are the themes put forward in this year's films in competition.

Among international films, the obtaining of freedom seems to dominate the narrative, directly or indirectly: freedom from others, freedom from want and fleeing one's circumstances. Stories of refugees that have marked this 21st century until now are never far from everyone's minds.

Transition toward adulthood is another prevailing topic for some filmmakers, and how the rite of passage, set in their specific worlds, is experienced by their characters within those worlds: a global theme explored through different eyes and a variety of angles.

For the second year running, we are delighted to present our Franco-Arab Rendez-Vous, a section that is born from the collaboration between the AIFF and the French Cultural Centre in Amman. Here again, migration and family seem to be starring as main characters throughout this selection.

So, sit back and feel free to experience all the venues where films will be screened during this third edition of our festival: be it the cinemas in Taj Mall, the Drive-In in Abdali or the amphitheatre at the Royal Film Commission. Enjoy the films and decide: with which of these stories might you be falling in love this year?!

We hope we can contribute to support these voices, precisely those who create images, sounds and stories that contribute – consciously or not - to defining the contours of their environment, their culture or that of others. We don't necessarily need to identify with the stories told, we just want to dream, reflect, be moved, provoked and... enjoy.

We conceived this festival as an open space for quality films and projects, an incubator for talents (young or less young), focusing above all on content, encounters and exchanges. Unlike what some believe, festivals are not there simply to showcase art house movies, which don't appeal to a large audience. Quality movies that push the boundaries of film are what we look for, and they are intended for all those who are eager to see, hear and feel.

On a different note, I am proud that our festival pursues its commitment to be as environmentally friendly as possible, taking concrete steps in that direction.

Last and not least, I would like to extend our immense gratitude to all those who believe in the value of such an event and are contributing to its perennity: its Board, our long-standing partners and the new ones, the Friends of the Festival and, last but not least, its incredibly committee, dynamic and dedicated team.

Look for little girls, for women, for refugees, and for inmates taking matters into their own hands. Beware of a crocodile taking swimmers by storm, and of a gravedigger ready to face death for love. Search with young men for the value and the meaning of dignity and identity. Live the world of a writer, who while fetching for his dreams - finds refuge in cinema. Be prepared to explore the limits of liberty, and to bear the weight of love, and of commitment.

The ardor of filmmakers will invite us for a Franco-Arab rendezvous where soul-searching in foreign, and in mountainous desolate lands, is inevitable. There, we will face the river, live the worries of a mother, take on the ambitions of a sister, and cross the Mediterranean to write a filial love letter to a mother.

Aligning with the festival's theme for the year, our selection carries the power of emotions; in all their various shapes and forms. We encourage you to buckle up and ride with us throughout those coming eight days across the finest debut collection of the year and navigate myriad dimensions of time, space, will power and culture. We grant you that you'll find euphoria in dystopia, and that you'll come to see both: truth and love.

Regional Training Programs for Arab Filmmakers!



RAWI Screenwriters Lab is one of the RFC's flagship training program, since 12 years. Independent Arab screenwriters are offered the chance to develop their work in a uniquely creative environment under the guidance of internationally acclaimed screenwriters.

Mosalsalat Screenwriters Lab is an annual four-day script development workshop aimed at independent Arab screenwriters working on their narrative TV series projects.

The Jordan Film Fund

The Jordan Film Fund (JFF), established by the RFC, aims to support narrative films and documentaries in the development, production and post-production phases; as well as short and animated films in the production phase, and television series in the development phase.

The JFF aims to strengthen the capacities of the independent film industry and support its sustainability, particularly in Jordan.

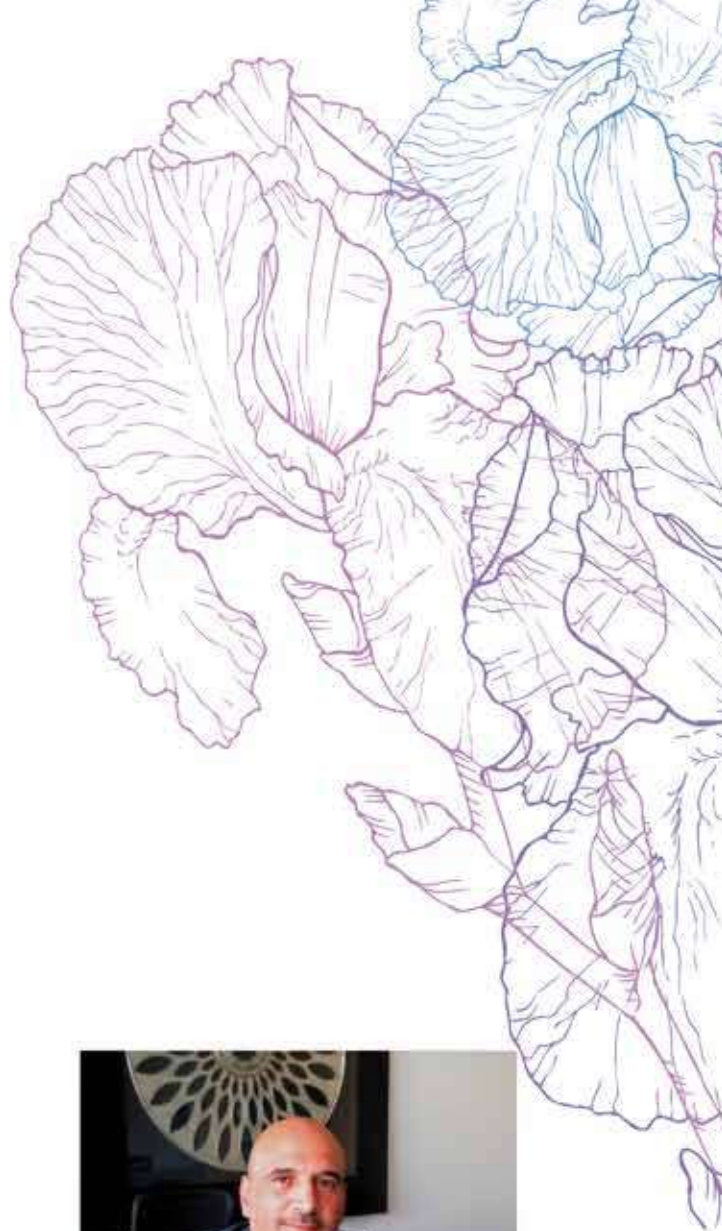

A FESTIVAL CONCERNED ABOUT ENVIRONMENT

We aim to lead by example and to create a positive impact by inspiring the Jordanian and the regional filmmaking industries. The AIFF is the first film festival of this scale in the region which places environmental advocacy as one of its core values.

Here are the steps the Festival understood this year to ensure its compliance with principles of sustainability:

- Offset the carbon footprint that might result from necessary actions, such as travelling and transportation, by giving a donation to the Arab Group for the Protection of Nature (APN) in order to plant trees in Jordan. Last year, we planted 674 trees all over the Kingdom. This year, we will also offset the activities that we couldn't reduce and plant more trees with APN.
- In the framework of the "Amman Film Industry Days", a day-long event named "Storytelling for Climate" is dedicated to developing films which are concerned with climate change. "Storytelling for Climate" is in cooperation with Beirut DC and Greener Screen. It is an inspirational day for filmmakers, not necessarily working on environmental films, but on movies that can include environmental messages.
- Reduce the waste and printed material and upcycle the material used in branding and artwork.
- Use environmentally friendly packaging.
- Remove diesel generators as a main source of power at the Drive-in cinemas.
- Incentivise electric vehicles.
- The Festival curated a panel in partnership with Greener Screen during TEDinArabic Regional Event in Amman in June, about the importance of integration of Climate Fiction (Cli-Fi).
- Initiate #SustainableCinema on social media platforms, as a branding and awareness tool to connect filmmaking with environment and climate change.

Arab Feature Narrative Competition



Nadine Khan

Nadine Khan is a filmmaker based in Cairo. She has directed several narrative films, commercials, TV series and music videos. Her début feature film *Chaos, Disorder* won the Jury Prize at the Dubai International Film Festival in 2012, the Best Film award at the Oran Arabic Film Festival in Algeria in 2013 and the Muscat International Film Festival in 2014. Khan's second feature *Abu Saddam* premiered at the 43rd Cairo International Film Festival in 2021. Khan was first noticed for her early short *One in a Million* (2006).



Luciano Barisone

Luciano Barisone is a film-club host, journalist and film critic for specialist magazines and newspapers. He founded the magazine *Panoramiques*, which he directed for several years. Since 1997, he has collaborated at numerous international film festivals, including the Locarno International Film Festival and the Mostra Internazionale d'Arte Cinematografica of Venice.

In 2002, he founded the Alba Infinity Festival, for which he has acted as Artistic Director until 2007. He was as tutor at the Master Documental of the Pompeu Fabra University in Barcelona between 2008 and 2011. From 2008 to 2010 he has been the artistic director at the Festival dei Popoli in Florence. Between 2011 and 2017, he was the Director of *Visions du Réel*, in Nyon, Switzerland. He acted as member of the Juries at Cannes (*Caméra d'Or*), *Hot Docs - Toronto*, *IDFA - Amsterdam*, *Sarajevo* and many others.



Samiha Khrais

Samiha Khrais is a Jordanian writer who worked as a journalist for many Jordanian and Arab newspapers. She is a member of the Jordanian Press Association, Jordanian Writers Society, Arab Writers Union and Pen International. In addition to being a scenarist and a playwright, Khrais had published 15 novels, including *The Panther's Tree*, *Poppy*, *Books of the Flood*, *Tree Stump*, *Slaves Peanut*, *Yahya* and *Blind Spot*. Khrais' work has been translated into Spanish, German, English, French, German, Russian and Serbian.

Khrais won Jordanian and Arab awards including the State Appreciation Award in Jordan, the Hussein Medal for Creative Excellence from Jordan, the Abu al-Qasim al-Shabi Award in Tunisia, the Literary Creativity Award from the Arab Thought Foundation and the Katara Award in Qatar.

Irène Challand

Irène Challand is a member of the Executive Board of the International Documentary Film Festival - Visions du Réel in Nyon (Switzerland) she is the Head of Public Value at the Headquarters of the Swiss Broadcasting Society (SRG), the Public Media Broadcaster. From 2001 to 2018, she led the Documentary Film Unit at the French-Swiss Radio and Television. There, she set up new programming policies, national and international co-productions and sought to strengthen links with independent producers and filmmakers in Switzerland and abroad. She was committed to developing international co-productions, several of which have won awards at the Berlin, Locarno, Venice, Toronto, Amsterdam, Nyon and Sundance Film Festivals and have been nominated for Oscars.



Phil Jandalay

Phil Jandalay has been a documentary editor for the last 20 years and has taken part in award-winning international productions like Nelly & Nadine, The Last Human and Killing Time. He now works as a rough-cut consultant on films like How To Save A Dead Friend, Home Games and How Big is the Galaxy. Working out of Sweden, his projects originated in places as far afield as Serbia, Kenya and Sierra Leone. He has travelled the world as a tutor with EDN and B2B Doc, as well as independently helping filmmakers develop their projects.



Aseel Mansour

Aseel Mansour is a Jordanian writer, director and producer. He has written, produced, and directed several films including The Great Arab Revolt (docudrama), Line of Sight (fiction), Uncle Nashaat (documentary), in addition to numerous TV series. In 2010 he co-founded Shashat, a multimedia production company in Amman, through which he created many TV shows and series. In 2017, Mansour started working with Arab Telemedia Productions as a consulting producer and writer, where he participated in the development of several high-budget TV series. Today, Mansour is managing Digital Content Strategy at Al Jazeera Media Network.

Carmen Lebbos

Carmen Lebbos is a Lebanese actress. She started her acting career in Ziad Al-Rahbani's plays and developed her talent and skills in the Institute of Fine Arts and by attending many intensive cinematic workshops in Oxford and Paris.

She played important roles in Arab and international movies (West Beirut, Zozo, Whatever Lola Wants, Lila Dit ça). In 2015 she was a jury member in the acting talent show "Arab Casting", as well as in different Arab and international film festivals.



Ameer Fakher Eldin

Ameer Fakher Eldin is a Syrian writer-director based in Germany, born in Kyiv in 1991 to Syrian parents from the occupied Golan Heights. His debut film *The Stranger* premiered at the 78th Venice International Film Festival, where it won the Edipo Re Award for Best Film, then garnered multiple prizes in international festivals and was selected as Palestine's Official Entry for Best International Feature Film at the 94th Academy Awards.

Fakher Eldin is currently working on his second feature narrative "Yunan".

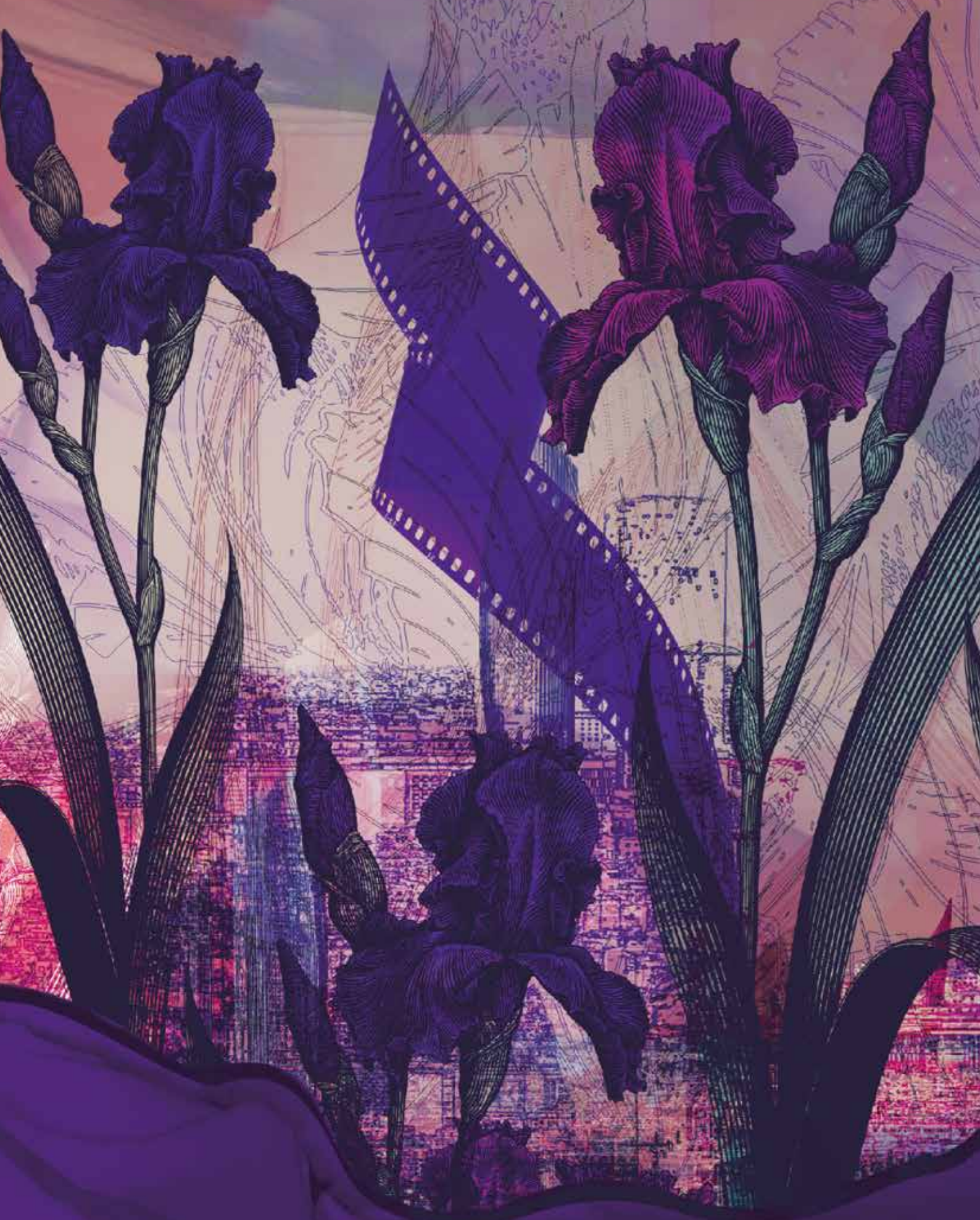


Nadia Eliewat

Nadia Eliewat is a Jordanian producer, screenwriter and script editor. In 2015, she established Screen Project production company in Jordan, through which she handpicks stories from all over the Arab world to produce for the screen. Eliewat is best known for producing and co-writing the Lebanese box-office hit *Mahbas* (2016) by Sophie Boutros and the Jordanian film *When Monaliza Smiled* (2012) by Fadi Haddad. She recently produced the first OSN original feature *Yellow Bus*, by Wendy Bednarz; the film is currently in post-Production.

She holds the academic rank of Associate Professor after teaching filmmaking at the American University in Dubai from 2017-2010.

A discussion with Yousry Nasrallah

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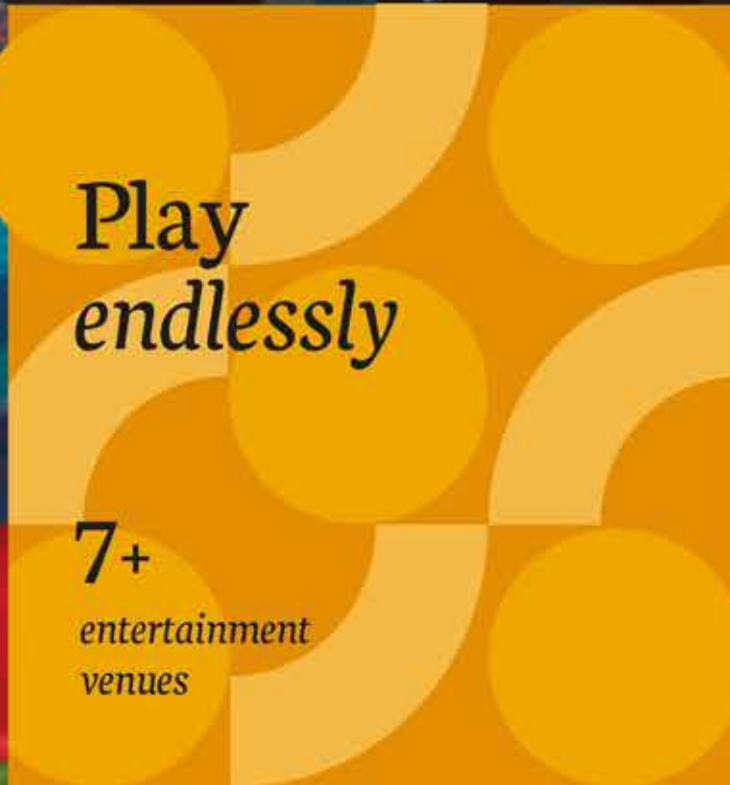


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First and latest, a discussion with Yousry Nasrallah

This non-competitive section presents an accomplished and renowned filmmaker, offering a closer look at their work and at how their filmmaking style has evolved over the years.

Yousry Nasrallah, representative of Egyptian auteur cinema, is our guest for the third edition of the Amman International Film Festival (AIFF). Nasrallah will take us on a journey starting with his very first film, visiting some of the experiences that influenced his cinematic language and ending with his latest production. The director will share his knowledge, expertise, and lessons learnt along the way, while analysing how challenges have helped him mature as a director.

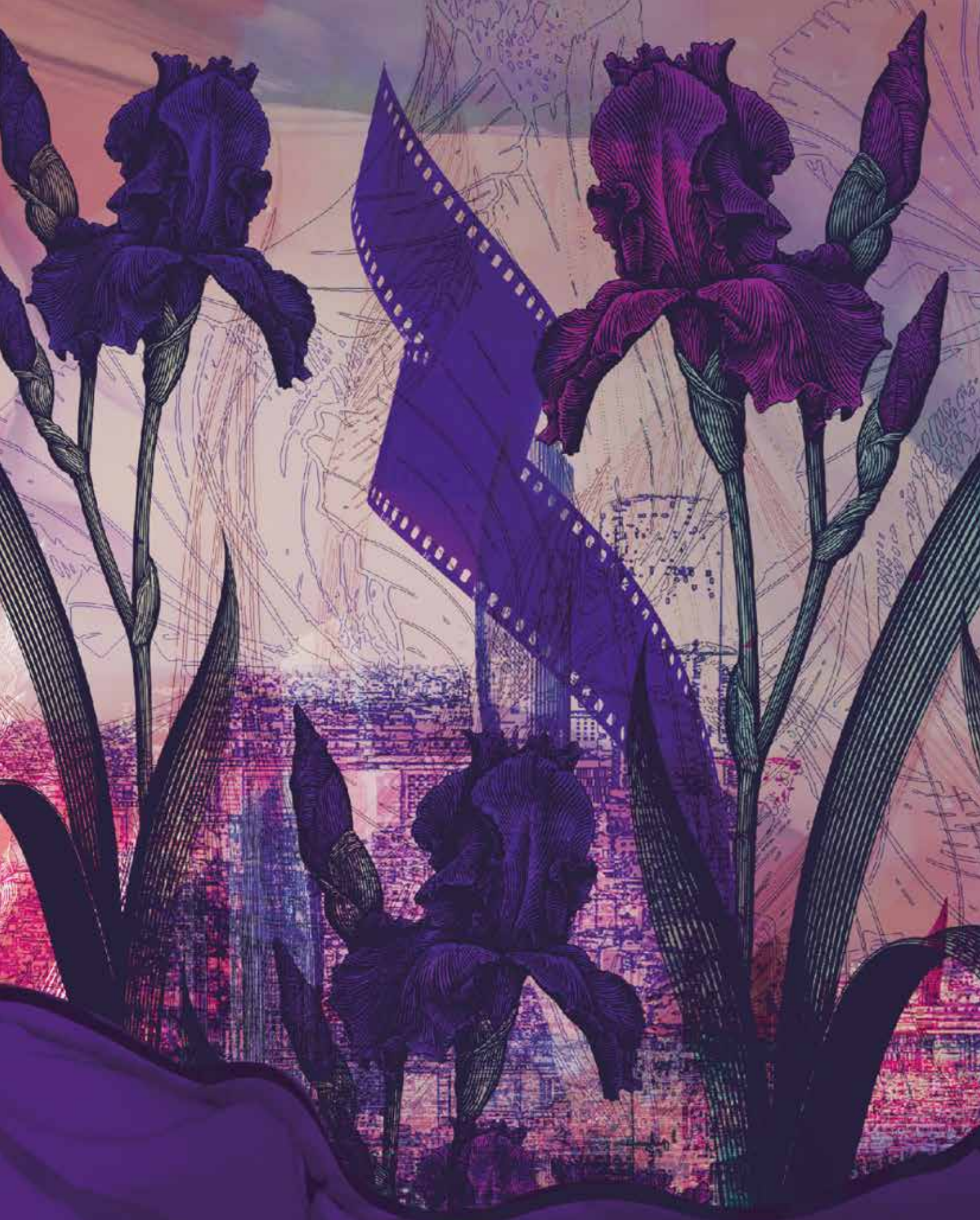
Yousry Nasrallah

Acclaimed Egyptian filmmaker, Yousry Nasrallah, initially studied economics and political sciences at Cairo University. He then studied cinema at the Higher Institute of Cinema before becoming a film critic and an assistant director in Beirut. Upon returning to Cairo in 1982, he worked with Youssef Chahine on a number of films starting with *Adieu Bonaparte* (1985) before going on to produce his own films.

In 1988, he shot his first feature-length narrative film, *Summer Thefts*, which was selected in The Directors' Fortnight (or *Quinzaine des Réalisateurs*), an independent selection of the Cannes Film Festival that same year. His second feature-length narrative, *Mercedes* (1993), was selected at the Locarno Film Festival. He went on to produce other films, including *On Boys, Girls and the Veil* (1995), a documentary about Egypt's young people, and *The City* (1999), which was awarded Locarno's Special Jury Prize. His eponymous book-to-screen adaptation of Elias Khoury's novel *The Gate of Sun* (2004) was an Official Selection in Cannes.

Nasrallah then went on to film *The Aquarium* (2008) and *Scheherazade, Tell Me a Story* (2009) which was screened at the Venice Film Festival. In 2011, his film *Interior/Exterior* was included in an anthology of shorts, *18 Days*, and screened at the Festival de Cannes in honour of Egypt. The following year he was nominated for the Palm d'Or in Cannes with his film, *After the Battle* (2012). His latest film *Brooks, Meadows and Lovely Faces* was nominated for the Golden Leopard in the Official Competition at the Locarno Film Festival in 2016. This year, Yousry Nasrallah presided over the 75th Festival de Cannes' Short Film Jury and directed the TV programme *Welcome Home*.

He received an MFA in Film Production from the USC School of Cinematic Arts, Los Angeles.

After a master's degree in mechanics, Zoulikha Tahar devoted herself, from 2015, to her passion for writing and film making. In 2017, in Algeria, she co-founded the AWAL collective with which she directed her short film *The Street*, a prose against street harassment. The same year, she was presented by France 24 as one of the five women who are most committed to change in Africa. In 2018 she began training in documentary cinema at the Film School "La Femis" in Paris. There, she directed her first documentary, *A Life of Essays*, a short documentary about the representations made, on both sides of the Mediterranean Sea, of Algerian immigrant women. The film was selected, in 2020, in the favorite category of Festival Panorama des cinémas du maghreb et du moyen-orient. In 2021, she made *L'hiver qui ne meurt jamais* a movie about windows, covid and borders. And *Kol Youm* a short documentary about women mental load. This film was made about her mom who since her retirement, has been doing all the household chores without getting any help from the rest of the family. Zoulikha is now working on her first long documentary about mental load. And righting a podcast where she talks about her experience with professional reorientation and the long-term impact of the choices parents make for their kids.

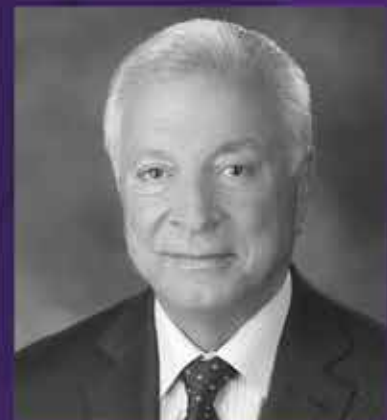
Dr. Omar N. Abdulhadi
